Battle of Hat Dich

Max Grund and Rob McFarlane (pictured below) 9RAR, both served and experienced operations in the Hat Dich area. Operation Goodwood was a reconnaissance-in-force (RF) operation by the Task Force into enemy base areas east of Saigon. Its purpose was to intercept enemy concentrations and to clear the Hat Dich area of enemy and destroy their assets. In the six-week period of Operation Goodwood, 235 enemy were killed at the cost of thirteen 9 RAR diggers. This operation is now commemorated as the Battle of Hat Dich for which 9RAR received battle honours. *Lest We Forget*.

RAT Kit Distribution - Concession Holders

As you may be aware, eligible Concession Card Holders are able to access free RATs. This was a Commonwealth Scheme, however due to funding changes, the scheme has changed and a decision has been reached to move the RATs Concession Card holder pick-ups to the Council Office.

What you need to do: Concession Card Holders must register, prior to collection which will be on Wednesdays only, between 10.00am and midday. To register, individuals will need to go to the SA Health website South Australian Government - Rapid antigen test collection (forms.sa.gov.au). Clients are also encouraged to call the office before presenting, to confirm their pick-up time.

It is important to remember that persons picking up, <u>must be well</u>. If you are unwell, ask someone else to pick up the tests on your behalf. All persons entering the Council office for RAT kit distribution, should be wearing a mask.

Concession Card Holders are eligible for 5 x RAT kits a month, but no more than 2 lots (10 kits)

Chris' story in his words: 'On Anzac Day, 2015, I was paddling in after an average morning of surf when I was attacked twice by a great white shark. I had lost a leg and if that wasn't bad enough, I was bleeding out and at the bottom of a cliff. If I made it to the top, it was still another 35 kilometres to the nearest country hospital on the Eyre Peninsula, South Australia. Then it was a further 600kilometres to the nearest trauma centre in Adelaide. The odds were definitely stacked in the shark's favour."

WATER

During the mid 1940's these reserves were sold to the nearest landowners. The Windmill Creek reserve was sold to Mr. S. Riches. The Poodra water reserve was sold to Dad, H. R. Jacobs, it became section 91 Hundred of Miltalie and contained 6.5 acres of land.

When the first percussion drill was sent over to Cowell it proved to be a small machine capable of a maximum depth of only 150ft. In most cases this was adequate, there being only one spot on Poodra that had to be abandoned that I can remember. Mr Morrison the driller resited the plant about 500 yards due west. Water was found, the quality being only suitable for adult sheep.

Another attempt to find water on the house side of the Kimba road was made, the borehole being sunk quite near the road. When the presence of water was detected the hole was about 50 feet deep, of quality almost like rainwater, so Dad wishing to find a bigger supply kept on drilling. Unfortunately the drilling bit became jammed in the hole and despite all attempts made by Mr. Morrison retrieval equipment from Adelaide had to be brought in to help. Not a very happy situation. Dad decided that a well would be sunk, so that the equipment could be salvaged, thus permitting a larger amount of water to be stored.

Eventually the well was sunk and the drilling bit and other equipment was salvaged. The well proved to be quite an asset as the horses and cows were able to be watered without crossing the road.

The Mines department sent further boring plants over to the Franklin Harbour area on quite a number of occasions, particularly when the number of applications justified it. Later in the Second World War years a larger plant was sent, and I signed up for the plant to drill a couple of holes.

The location where I wished to find water was in or near section 35, as this paddock had no water at all. The second place was at Pike's corner, when a well had done a really great job, but I considered a borehole would be an advantage, the well then being used as a stand-by.

The first hole put down was on section 34, near the road going up to White Hill. I went down to 90 feet, the water was of good quality but poor supply. The second hole was at Pike's corner. The problem was how to get the plant into the creek. The boring plant was a fairly heavy constructed implement pulled by a tractor. The front section was on a turntable. On arriving at the creek we had to descend a steep bank an make a sharp turn to the right then thread a passage between native pines. The back wheels of the boring plant were each separately chained, and a heavy water mallee post was also put through the wheel spokes, just in case the pressure of the load broke the chains. This would give us adequate braking for the descent into the creek. The tractor was started and using low gear the descent began, and everything proceeded well, the dragging of the back wheels of boring plant dug quite deep furrows down the bank. Immediately the right hand turn was made the tractor was reversed to release the pressure on the chain and post in order to permit their removal, we then proceeded to the site picked. This site was only 20 yards for the well that had been used for many years.

The plant operator was Mr. Morrison who had worked with the department of Mines for many years; he was a Canadian by birth. He picked the site for the boreholes and this particular site was a very good one, delivering all the water we wanted at a depth of 52 feet. Although up on flat ground about ten feet above the creek bed level, we still had to bore through wash sand and loose rock. While the hole was being drilled casing had to be used to stop wash sand and stones from falling in and causing problems. Only one full days boring was necessary and by dinner time the next day the hole was complete to 52 feet and a good supply of water obtained. That happened on the day the Second World War ended. A windmill on a thirty-foot tower was erected and a 10,000-gallon concrete water tank was built. The water from this tank was piped to a 20 feet water trough controlled by a ball cock, thus rendering caring for the stock on this portion of the farm easy.
