Franklin Harbour Shining bright!

2021 started on a very positive note and with a bang, with a very well supported and successful Pyrotechnics night. Franklin Harbour was one of only a handful of councils in the state that elected to proceed with either a Christmas pageant or a New Year's fireworks. We were prepared to cancel with short notice should the COVID situation deteriorate but planned for success and were well rewarded with two excellent community events to brighten the close of 2020, and the beginning of 2021.

This is going to be a very busy year in Franklin Harbour, and by years end a remarkable transformation will have taken place in the Cowell foreshore area with a new Marina, considerably more useable and attractive green space, a new aquatic playground with water slides and a large bouncy pillow, and better and safer vehicle access with the opening of the Second Street extension.

The Marina is now nearing completion, with the last Pylons scheduled to be driven in the next week.

The "mountains of dirt" in the foreshore area will start to come down in coming weeks, and work will "ramp up" on the construction of the new road. The Marina pontoons are now almost all built and just awaiting the lifting of border restrictions to allow delivery and installation. February will see the Marina building construction commence.

The Wallaroo – Lucky Bay Ferry recommenced operations on November 14 and by December 30 had already taken its 1000th vehicle across. Passenger numbers have been very healthy and increased activity in the Cowell Main Street is very evident. There has been a very clear increase in both business activity and real estate sales in Cowell in recent months, and this has further increased in January. This is particularly pleasing given that our peak season tends to be Feb/March/April.

Our district has seen the best harvest in quite a few years which is great news for our many farming families, and a great positive for the local economy and the wider community. T-Ports at Lucky Bay continue to receive grain deliveries for transhipment and whilst final tonnage for the season is not yet available, it has clearly been a successful year for them and they have been well supported by local growers. Let's hope 2021 brings with it an even better season!

Happy New Year to you all! Let's make it a good one.

In my time in Cowell the single biggest concern that residents have consistently raised with me is our lack of full time Doctor coverage in Cowell. We can start 2021 with some very good news on this front by announcing that commencing very soon (date to be confirmed shortly) we will see an extension of medical services in Cowell with additional Doctors working from the Cowell Medical Clinic on the days currently not being serviced (Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays).

The Doctors have been appointed and there will be a media release with more details coming out in the very near future. This really is great news for Cowell and the district.



The <u>draft Suicide Prevention Bill</u> proposes to establish measures to reduce suicide in South Australia. It will promote a whole of community focus on suicide, underpinned by sustained engagement with the community, government and non-government agencies, and services and community organisations such as Suicide Prevention Networks..


