Cowell Gym is up and running

In late 2020, a determined group from the Cowell Netball Club set themselves a big challenge when they applied for some of the Drought Relief funding to build new Netball clubrooms incorporating a gym. Given the "less than best" state of their existing clubrooms, and the fact that Cowell was lacking a public gym, they were successful in their application for funds. This was by no means a fully funded project, the Cowell Netball Club committed considerable existing funds of their own, and to a program of fund raising.

Getting the funds proved to be the easy part because it was at this time that COVID burst onto the scene with its shutdowns, logistics issues, price rises, and an ongoing shortage of building products. COVID was to be no match for the indomitable ladies of the Cowell Netball club, they pushed on with their building plans and approvals, and then managed the build themselves employing subcontractors, skilfully managed a tight budget, and a program of fundraising.

And they delivered on all counts, they delivered a fabulous spacious well equipped clubroom facility and a huge and well equipped gym....and yes it is bigger than Cleve's

The Gym is now open to the public, with 110 members already signed up. It is accessible 7 days per week with an electronic key via a phone app, or a key fob for non phone users. Thus far it is averaging 25 users per day from a variety of age groups.

Local physio, Sophie Cohen, has been utilising it for rehab programs with some of her clients which greatly assists Improving mobility. Coming soon in the not to distant future will be group exercise classes at the Cowell Gym.

The Cowell Foreshore Redevelopment

The water playground and jumping pillow are now installed and fully operational but not yet open to the public.

Although looking much neater, the area is still very much a worksite. The irrigation installation will be complete in two weeks, then paving and landscaping works will be done very quickly, and then around 2000sqm of turf will be laid around the water park area, and 11,000sqm of spray seeded lawn will be applied in the much larger area.

The Marina gangways have been installed in the last few days, and we are just awaiting the pylon brackets that attach the pontoons to the Pylons. (these are caught up in a factory badly impacted by the East Coast floods)

By this time next month we should be ever so close to completion of these works.

The Cowell Ambulance Team is in need of new recruits!

SA Ambulance Service (SAAS) is calling on Cowell residents to rise to the challenge and find out more about becoming an ambulance volunteer.

The challenge comes as the Cowell team prepares for its major training launch in March and April 2022.

"The Cowell community relies on a handful of dedicated volunteers to provide ambulance services to the area. Without them we have to rely on volunteers from neighbouring towns such as Cleve to help out," said Campbell Forsyth, Regional Team Leader. The Cowell team attended approximately 140 incidents last year



with the majority of these being non-urgent cases or transfers to the local airfield, or to the Cowell and Cleve Hospitals.

Without SAAS volunteers, rural communities like Cowell wouldn't have additional support for emergency and non-emergency ambulance services in the community and would rely heavily on neighboring communities to respond.

SAAS is looking for local people to support the community and the ambulance team to ensure a sustainable service is provided to the Cowell area. Volunteers don't need to be on call 24/7; a roster is arranged around availability and the more members we have the fewer shifts are needing to be filled. Volunteers aren't required to stay on the station, they respond from home or work if needed.

Previous experience or medical training is not a prerequisite as SAAS provides all the necessary training. Training can be set at a pace to suit the person with a mixture of online and face to face sessions held locally in Cowell. Mentoring and support is provided by the Regional Team Leader and senior members on the Cowell team.

The Cowell team train weekly on Tuesday evenings from 7:00pm to 9:00pm during the school term.

FRANKLIN HARBOUR SHOW SOCIETY

All my life I was very interested in shows, so attending many meetings and accepting different tasks broadened my knowledge tremendously. It was a pleasure to serve in the sheep section, under the guidance of the late Merv Smith and to observe the judges at work and to hear their comments.

Later I was given the task of being the wool convenor, and when the judging was taking place, these people would make comments about the fleeces of wool that I found very helpful to my own flock of sheep.

At one annual meeting I was nominated as chairman but was rather hesitant about accepting this high posy, but the people at the meeting promised support and guidance so the position was accepted. The secretary position was also altered and Frank Rehn was nominated to this position, giving the Franklin Harbour Show Society a new team. The former chairman was a Mr Shillabeers and the secretary was the late John McFarlane. The Franklin Harbour Show Society held its first show at a Mr. Frost's place at Yabmana in 1895, and the last country show was held at Mr. George Elleway's property, since that time all shows have been held on the Cowell Show ground.

When our first show was coming up our food convenor, Mrs. Ern Riches reported that there was practically no crockery or cutlery held by the society, so we made this our priority for the coming years. Mrs. Riches volunteered to take care of the materials we bought, and to lease out to any person or club at a set price, with all breakages to be replaced. This worked well and Mr. Riches prepared cupboards and boxes to be stored in their home.

The horses were another problem area, the show society had to compete with the people who were holding gymkhanas during show time. The chairman of the Owners' Drivers and Reins men Association was most concerned about these events and decided to hold a meeting at Port Neill to gauge the feelings of the show societies.

At the meeting there were six societies represented, they were Kimba, Cleve, Lipson, Cummins, Yallunda Flat and Franklin Harbour. At the conclusion of the meeting, and after discussing at length with secretary Frank Rehn, I announced that the Franklin Harbour. Shows society would call a special meeting of all societies to form a Shows Association, and the Owners and Breeders promised to give all Show Societies their unqualified support during the show season. This meeting was duly held at Port Neill and the late Stan Carr of Lipson was the first president of the Association.

The original show ground only had a very small trotting track and the show society wanted to enlarge it to a half-mile track so that registered meetings could be held. The Whyalla-Port Lincoln road was being planned and this made available all the land on the northern end of the show ground. By having this land included in the show ground it would enable us to enlarge the trotting track arena to half-mile, fortunately the Council agreed. We, the society, authorized the late Mr. Tom Hanson to collect money for this purpose. There being enough money donated the trotting track was extended and registered trotting meetings have been held ever since.

Camping Around Franklin Harbour

Did you know that camping areas are provided in the following areas within the Franklin Harbour:

The RV Park, Beach Access Sites on Beach Road, Port Gibbon, Lucky Bay and Ulbana Weir (Payne's Weir)

All campers must have self contained toilet facilities except where toilet facilities are provided.

Permits are required to camp within the Port Gibbon & Lucky Bay area for \$15 per night per vehicle or \$75 per week per vehicle with a maximum stay of 14 days. These can be purchased at the allocated pay stations at the locations listed as well as the Council Office, Cowell Hardware, Cowell Roadhouse.

Permits are required at all other camp sites including Ulbana Weir, RV Park and accesses along Beach Road for \$10 per night per vehicle or \$50 per week per vehicle with a maximum stay of 14 days.

Local Residents and Rate Payers are able to camp at no cost.
