Wetland Update

As you would be aware this area is currently under construction and when complete will be a complementary addition to the Cowell Foreshore redevelopment, that was completed in early 2023.

It will add an additional 14,370sqm of open space to the foreshore area. To date, this space has been filled and had three ponds created and linked. Once the Wetland area is complete, these ponds will act as a filtration system for stormwater from our main street, most of which will now, not enter the marine environment.

The largest pond has an island in the middle which will be linked to the rest of the space by paths and two footbridges. (see concept). The concrete abutments for the bridges have been poured, and the bridges and their footings will be completed during the next fortnight.

Works on this project are now ramping up and will include the following :

- Excavate and construct footings, and assemble the footbridges
- Pour slab & construct shed to house Historic Lifeboat
- Finalise footbridge assembly
- Kerbing to the Esplanade
- Electrical connections
- Construction of Pathways and edging
- Installation of subsurface irrigation for areas to be lawned
- Installation of drip irrigation system for new plantings



- Lay Turf
- Plantings
- Install ANZAC sculptures
- Seating and lighting installation
- Install posts and memorial plaques for local ANZACS named on Cowell War memorial
- "Remembrance Park" Entrance constructed
- Signage
- Carparking and line marking

We are aiming to have 90% of this project complete by June 30, 2024. This is a challenging schedule as planting alone will be approximately 8000 plants. Once the plantings are in and begin to become established, this area will become a haven for plants and wildlife (the ducks of Eastern Eyre have already discovered it!) and a spectacular addition to the already fabulous Cowell Foreshore.



Franklin Harbour History Museum

The History Museum has decided to inform the General Public of our activities on a Semi regular Basis.

As there has been recent interest in the "Ruston Proctor" We have decided to provide a History around the Tractor.

It's earliest history is when it came off the last Coaster Steamer to Cowell, partly assembled, on the 26th January 1910. It was purchased by Asa Fairbank Snr in early 1911 for 2,000 pounds.

It had several owners, Fred Turner / Cowell, George Nicolson / Roopena Station via Whyalla, then Les Hudson of Lock, but remained at Roopena.

Mr. Hudson donated it to the "Franklin Harbour National Trust Museum" and it was transported by Brambles on the 15th July 1969 from "Roopena Stn" to Cowell. It was then restored by Ross Guthleben and several Volunteers and had its first official run in November 1972. On April 21st 1980 the Certificate of Registration was withdrawn as the Boiler did not pass its Annual inspection with the Registrations and De-registrations. It was Deregistered on 2nd June 1992.

It has remained as an exhibit at our Agricultural Museum until Spring of 2019, when it was transported to Cobdogla Steam Engine Enthusiasts as part of their Field Day, and in appreciation, they offered their expert volunteers to restore it to working order at no cost to us.


The restoration is nearing completion and we hope you enjoy the photos included in this article.

It is the only operational Steam Engine of its type in Australia. We do not have a return date as yet. The Cobdogla Volunteers are putting countless, man hours to ensure its earliest return to the "Franklin Harbour Agricultural Museum"

Camping Around Franklin Harbour

To book a site within the District Council of Franklin Harbour permits must be obtained online at www.eyrepeninsula.com/camping.

All campers must have self contained toilet facilities except where toilet facilities are provided. Local Residents and Ratepayers are able to camp at no cost however must still book online.

To book a permit online there are 3 campground areas:

'Port Gibbon Beach Camping' formerly known as the beach access sites these includes Port gibbon jetty, Hideaway, The Fence, Serenity, Flat Rocks, The Sanctuary and White Sands.

'Point Gibbon Campgrounds' includes Point Gibbon (15 allocated sites), Dunes, Mills Steps, Bush and Boat shed.

'Cowell RV Park' which has 22 designated sites.
