The new marina will soon be complete with the basin fully dug out, the entrance opened to the channel, and all pontoons in place. Work will also accelerate on the base works to the new road linking the foreshore precinct to Second Street, the large area of land adjacent the Marina will continue to be levelled in preparation for landscaping, work on the building overlooking the Marina will commence, as will preparation work for the large bouncy pillow and shade sail.

We understand that the foreshore works have caused some disruption to parking around the boat ramp area but please bear in mind that this is only short term, and as the say "no pain no gain". Once the foreshore works are complete there will be more parking than ever in this area.

2021 will be the year of a global roll-out of Covid vaccinations. This will greatly progress the fight against this insidious virus, and will hopefully see a settling, and ultimately a return, to some sort of normality.

We will, in the coming month once again have Doctors practicing in Cowell all week, which is fabulous progress. There is more good news on the Medical Front for the Cowell district. The two new Doctors to the Mid-Eyre Medical Practice: Dr Lim and Dr He, will not only be consulting in Cowell on Mondays / Wednesdays / Fridays but they have also chosen to live in Cowell, and will shortly be moving into the Doctors residence. Roads

During March/April another 6kms of the Beach Road will be sealed, the last 3km to Port Gibbon will be completed in the next financial year.

With the advent of the T-Ports facility at Lucky Bay, both the Cowell-Kimba and Lucky Bay roads have become heavy freight routes, which they were never designed to be, and as such the additional heavy traffic is causing some damage, particularly on the Cowell-Kimba Road. More than patching is required and we are waiting for the contractor to become available to make some much needed repairs. They are now scheduled to be here in April to complete this work. In the longer term, this road will need to be widened and upgraded.



The SA Healthy Towns Challenge is a grants program for regional and rural towns to develop preventive health programs within their community, which will have measurable benefits (over 12 months) to the community's health and wellbeing. Successful projects aim to increase access or opportunity for the community to make healthier choices or participate in activities with a prevention focus.

Grants of up to \$50,000 each will be provided to a minimum of five towns.
