Choosing Local Government over the Corporate world, and the country over the city, was seen by many of my friends and former colleagues as either some form of "madness" or, at the very least, a mid-life crisis! Marina and Foreshore Works

After a bit of preaching above (sorry about that!), now it's time for a confession. I have previously gone on the record saying that the Marina would be complete by the end of October but we have had a few "hiccups" that will now delay completion until around Christmas.

Despite the delays, the digging of the basin and the placing of the pylons continue to proceed well. In November you will see some additional activity with the first load of pontoons scheduled to arrive, works will commence on the limestone steps in front of the Marina building, as will the earthworks and footing for the Marina building. This building will contain toilets/showers, a café, and a large undercover area. The area between the Marina and the Fishbox will be landscaped and "greened" and will be on average 1 metre higher than the causeway to the Jetty, making it a good area to view the harbour from. There will also be car parking constructed next to the marina building overlooking the marina.

The current "mountains of earth" in the Marina/Foreshore area will also start to come down as we fill and shape the areas to be landscaped.



The Ferry

T-Ports are enthusiastically gearing up to handle their first real harvest and Spencer Gulf SeaRoad anticipate the Aurora V (ferry) being back in service in the next few weeks. It has been held up in survey in Adelaide but should be en-route to the Spencer Gulf very shortly.
