As I write this South Australia has hit the headlines with a serious cluster of COVID-19. Some good news is that Saturday 14th November saw the restarting of operations for the Wallaroo to Lucky Bay Ferry. We need to make sure this service is

The Year Ahead

By the end of the year our Marina will largely be complete, we then have until the end of 2021 to complete the Foreshore Redevelopment. The major components of the Foreshore Redevelopment are:

- 1. Marina Building
- Landscaping of the area between the Marina and the Fishbox
- 3. Second Street Extension
- 4. Water playground area and landscaping
- 5. Large Bouncy Pillow under shade
- 6. Landscaping and additional carparking to area in front of caravan park
- 7. Relocation of the War Memorial

Attached is a plan showing the layout of the foreshore area.

This is a very significant scope of works to complete, and we now have 58 weeks to complete. The building pad for the marina building is in place and construction is scheduled to commence in the next few weeks. Some base works have started on the second street extension.

The bulk of the works included in the Foreshore Redevelopment will commence early in 2021 and are scheduled to be complete by Christmas 2021.

Mundy Bros 1910-1916

Daniel Mundy 1910—1916

Dick Bunn 1910-1915

Bill Surfield 1913-1916

Don Blake 1945ish

Daniel Mundy lived in Molly Ogdens house and possibly built it. Dick Burn lived at Elbow Hill possibly built Honeymoon Cottage as he lived in it for a short time.

Bill Surfield Elbow Hill

Don Blake lived in a small building behind 17 Second Street whilst he built the house. Not much more is known about him.

FYI Bill Surfield married Sara Theodore Beinke sister to Alice Carmody.

To identify the builders they usually leave their mark somewhere on the house, usually the chimney.



Dinner at the Shed Tanks

The Shed Tanks are located between Cowell and Kimba in the Hundred of James. Originally a Government funded shed catching water into galvanised tanks erected near the halfway point between the two towns over 100 years ago. They provided a place for horses to spell and drink. In future years it was a location for motor vehicles to replenish radiators and for drivers and passengers to break up the journey. Today they are in need of repair to preserve the history of our pioneers and memories of families far and wide.

A committee has been formed from the towns of Cowell and Kimba to bring together their collective minds and provide a Black-Tie Event to raise funds for the restoration of the Shed Tanks. It is agreed that this committee will work to maintain the heritage of the site for generations to come and to provide an event like no other at this iconic location. 

The RV Park, Beach Access Sites on Beach Road, Port Gibbon, Lucky Bay and Ulbana Weir (Payne's

All campers must have self contained toilet facilities except where toilet facilities are provided.

Permits are required to camp within the Port Gibbon & Lucky Bay area for \$15 per night per vehicle or \$75 per week per vehicle with a maximum stay of 14 days. These can be purchased at the allocated pay stations at the locations listed as well as the Council Office, Cowell Hardware, Cowell Roadhouse.

Permits are required at all other camp sites including Ulbana Weir, RV Park and accesses along Beach Road for \$10 per night per vehicle or \$50 per week per vehicle with a maximum stay of 14 days.

Local Residents and Rate Payers are able to camp at no cost.
